What do they look like?

- Beavers are the largest rodent in North America. They can weigh between 30 and 100 pounds.

What do they eat?

Why are they important to New Hampshire history?

Early European settlers to America shipped thousands of beaver pelts to Europe where they became fashionable, mainly to make hats.

Beaver pelts were the most popular trade item between the settlers and the Abenaki. But both the Abenaki and settlers hunted the beaver too much, and beavers almost became extinct!
