What do they look like?

 Bobcats are the most common wildcat in North America.

 They have fluffy gray fur with black spots.

What do they eat?

Bobcats eat mice, squirrels, groundhogs, moles, raccoons, foxes, birds, reptiles, porcupines, and skunks.

Where do they live?

- Although bobcats can be found all over New Hampshire, they are most common in the Monadnock Region, Lakes Region, and along the Connecticut River.
- Bobcats like to live in forests, swamps, farm lands, and rocky areas.
