



New Hampshire Giant Traveling Map Frequently Asked Questions

How do I reserve the map?

Contact Assistant Director of Education and Public Programs Jenn Walton jwalton@nhhistory.org or 603-856-0645 with questions or to reserve the map. To confirm your dates, you must fill out, sign, and return the Host Agreement Form.

How long can I keep the map?

A school, district, or organization can reserve the map for up to two weeks.

How do I get the map?

A school, district, or organization is responsible for all transportation of the map and the accompanying trunk of supplies and activities. The map must be picked up and returned to the New Hampshire Historical Society at 30 Park Street, Concord. Shipping is not available at this time.

How much does the map cost?

There is no fee to borrow the map. However, if any damage is done to the map, the host school, district, or organization is responsible covering the cost of damage, up to \$2,000.00.

How big is the map?

The map is 16' x 20', and we recommend allowing another 2 feet of open space on all sides for easy movement around the map. Remember, no shoes are allowed on the map, so space around the map to allow people to walk is essential to protecting it.

What is the map made of?

The map is made of heavy-duty vinyl, and in a large space, it will lay flat on the floor without the need for any adhesives or weights. We recommend borrowers lay the map out flat several days before it is used so the folds have time to settle.

What can I do with the map?

The map can be used with any grade level or age group. Learners can explore geography, science, math, history, and much more. Easy-to-use lesson plans, activity suggestions, and materials geared for upper elementary learners are included in the trunk with the map.
