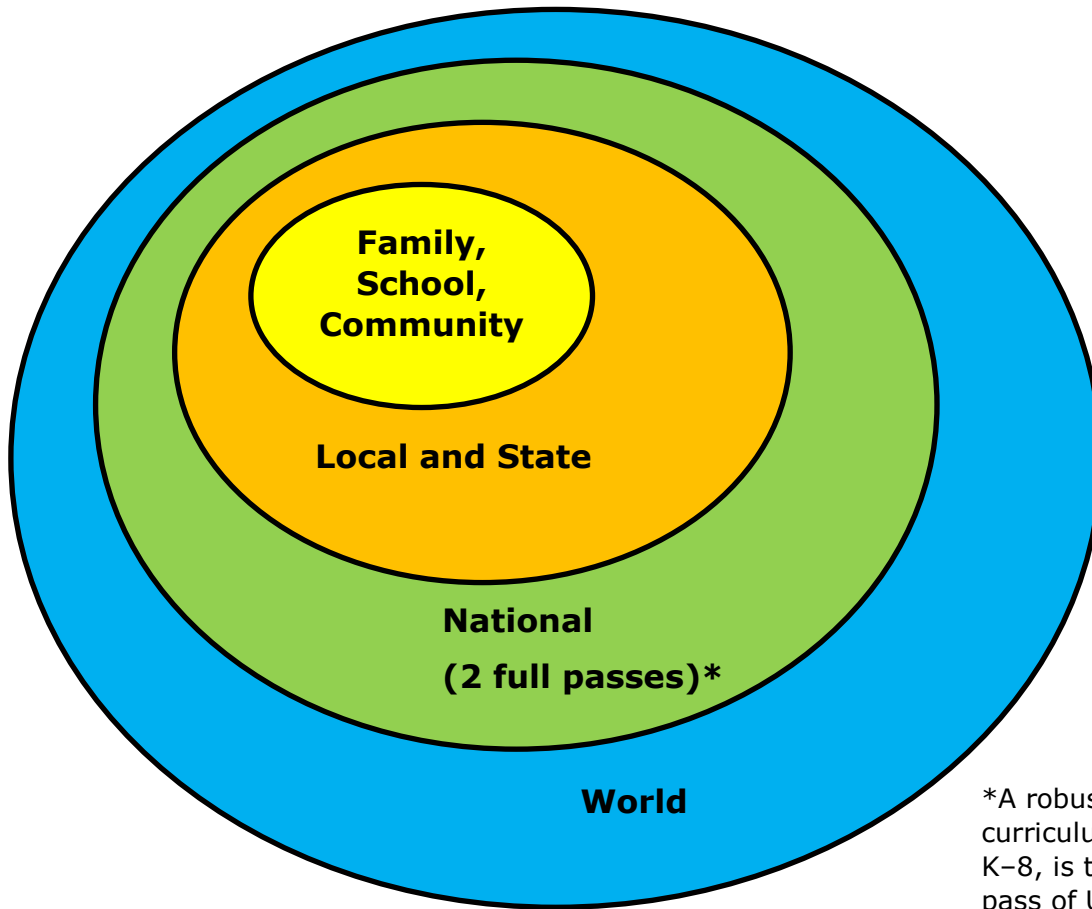


# Social Studies in New Hampshire

## Suggested Scope and Sequencing



\*A robust state history curriculum, delivered in K-8, is the preferred first pass of U.S. history.

**Kindergarten – Grade 1:** Family and School (culture, symbols, rules, community)

**Grade 2:** Geography (Unit 1); holidays, symbols, traditions

**Grade 3:** Abenaki before Contact (Unit 2); colonial New Hampshire (Units 3 and 4)

**Grade 4:** American Revolution and Establishing Governments (Units 5 and 6); Building a State (Unit 7); Farming in NH (Unit 8); Reform (Unit 9)

**Grade 5:** Civil War (Unit 10); Industrialization (Unit 11); Immigration (Unit 12); Tourism (Unit 13); Preserving NH (Unit 14); Civics and Government Today (Unit 18—partial)

**Grade 6:** Modern New Hampshire (Unit 15); NH Primary (Unit 16); NH Today (Unit 17); Civics and Government Today (Unit 18—partial)

**Grades 7 – 8:** Civics and Government Today (Unit 18); World history and geography
