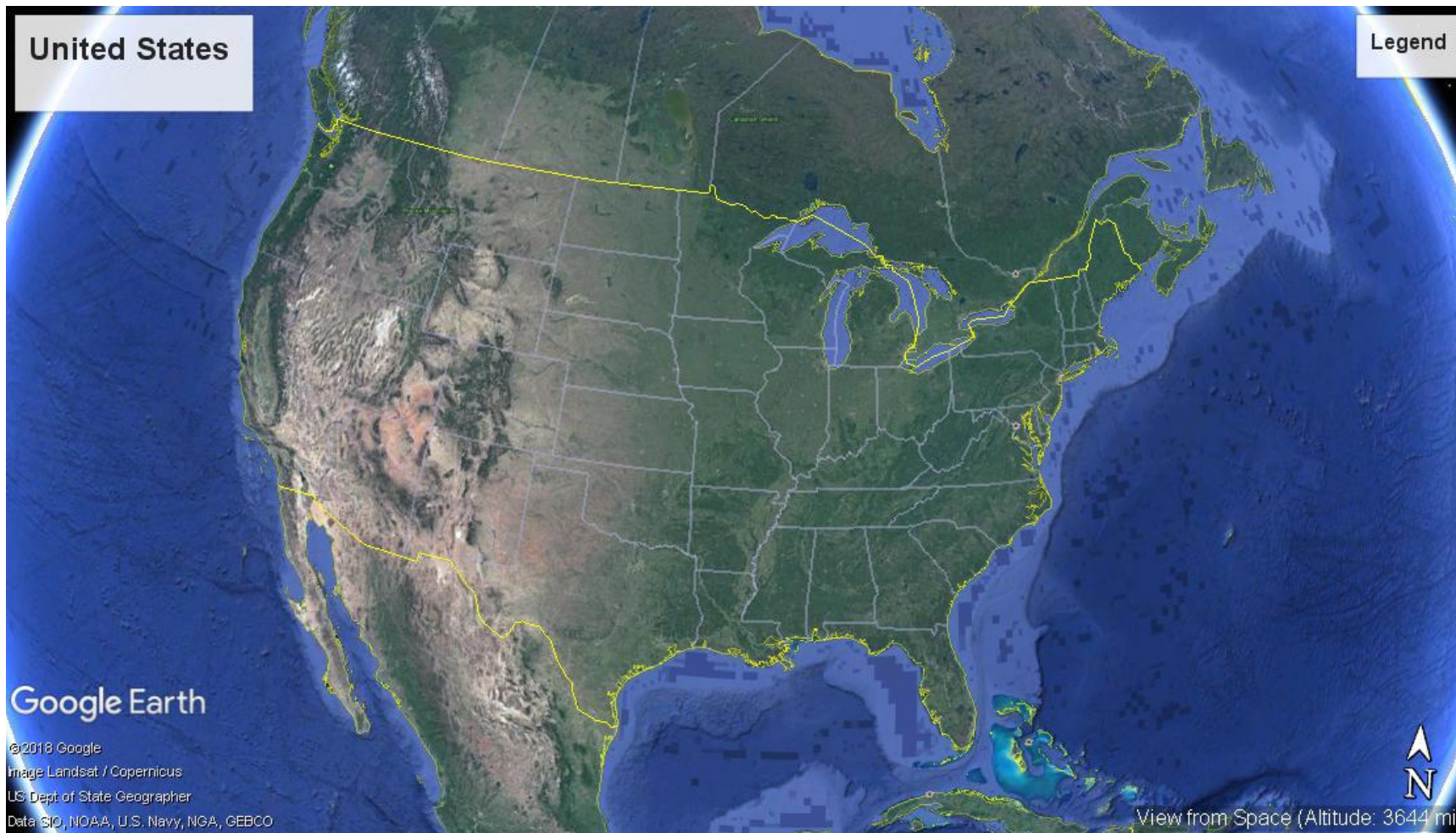
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Map of North America, with Country Borders

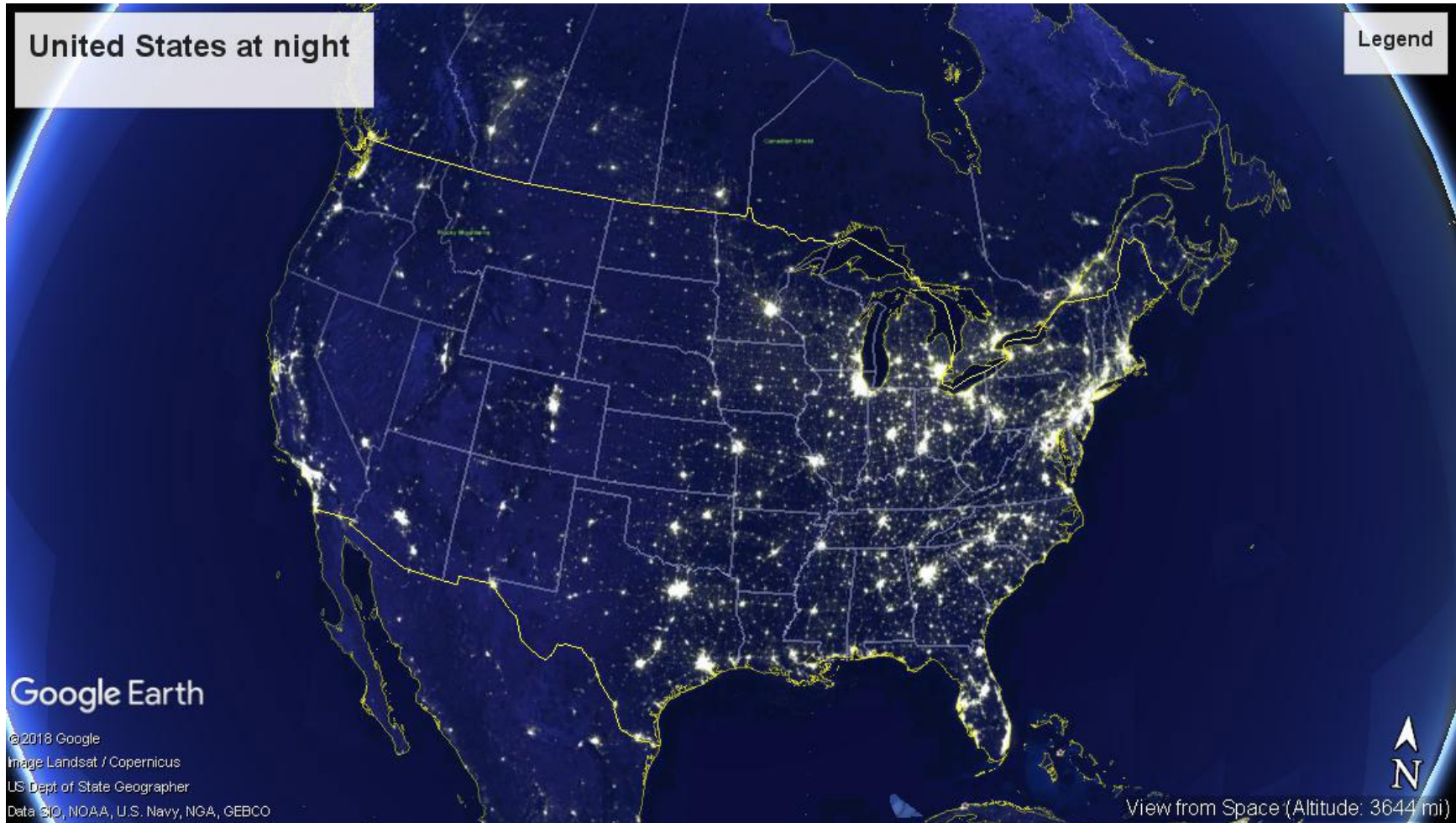
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Map of the United States

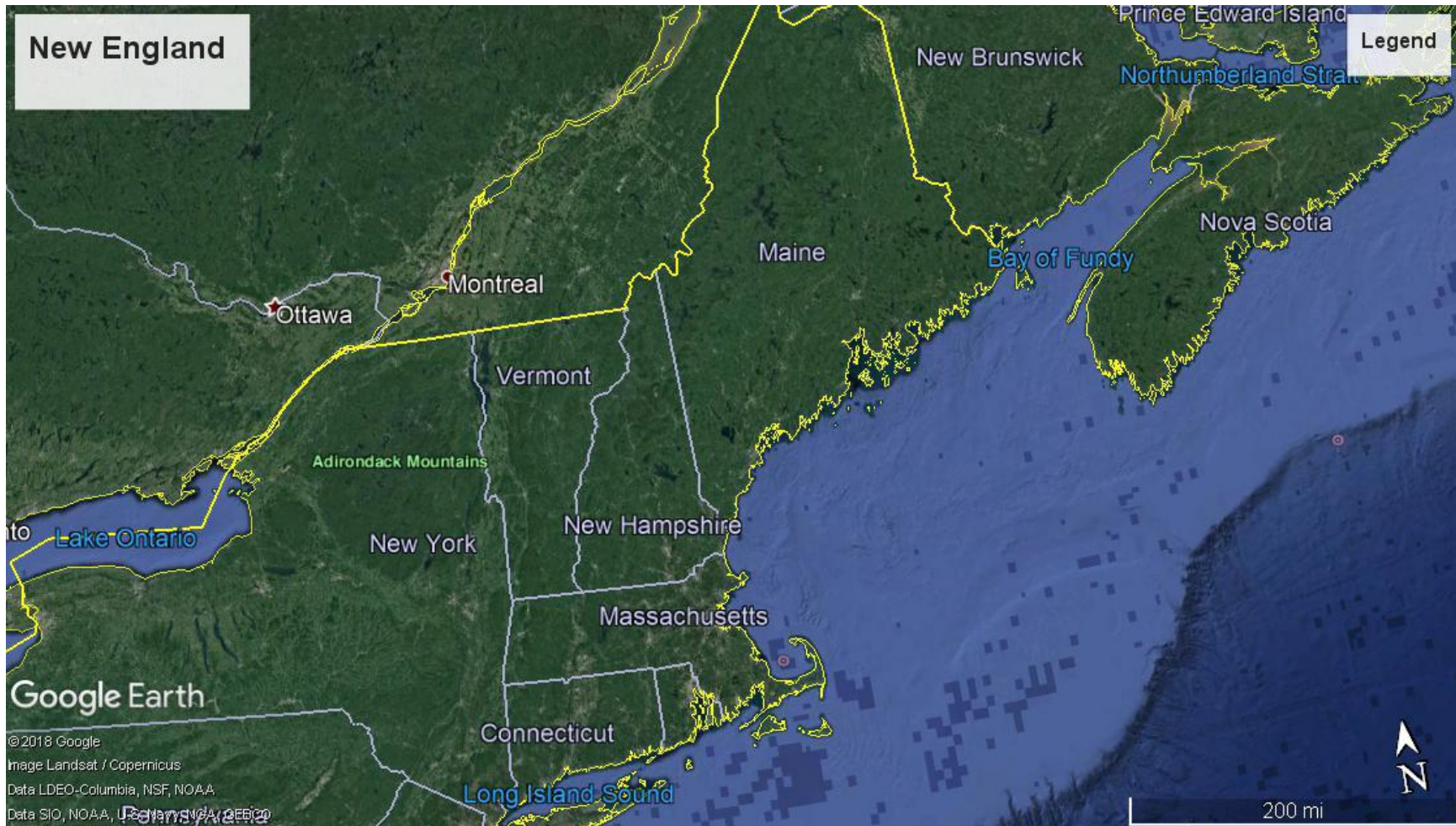
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Map of the United States at Night

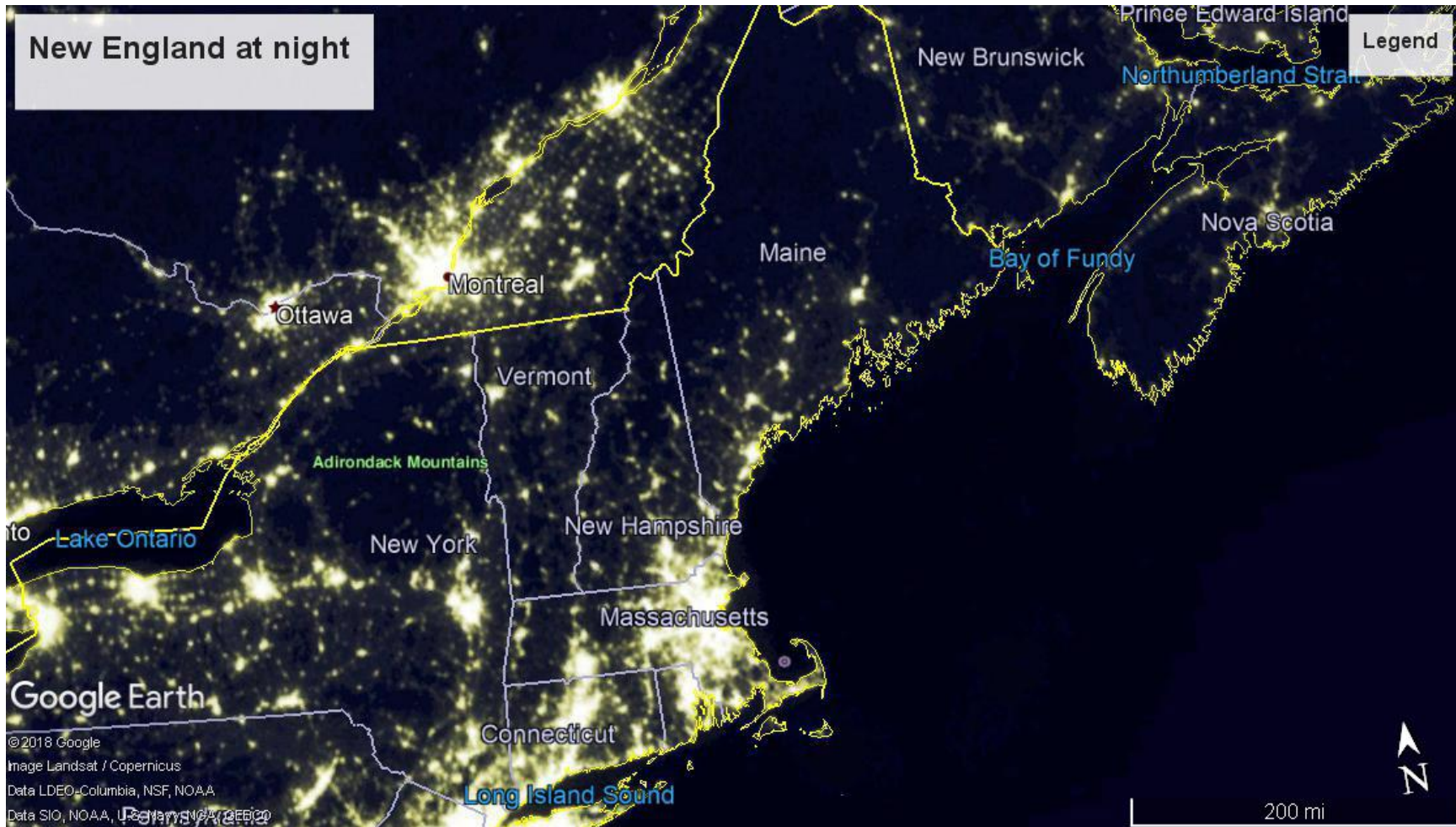
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Map of New England

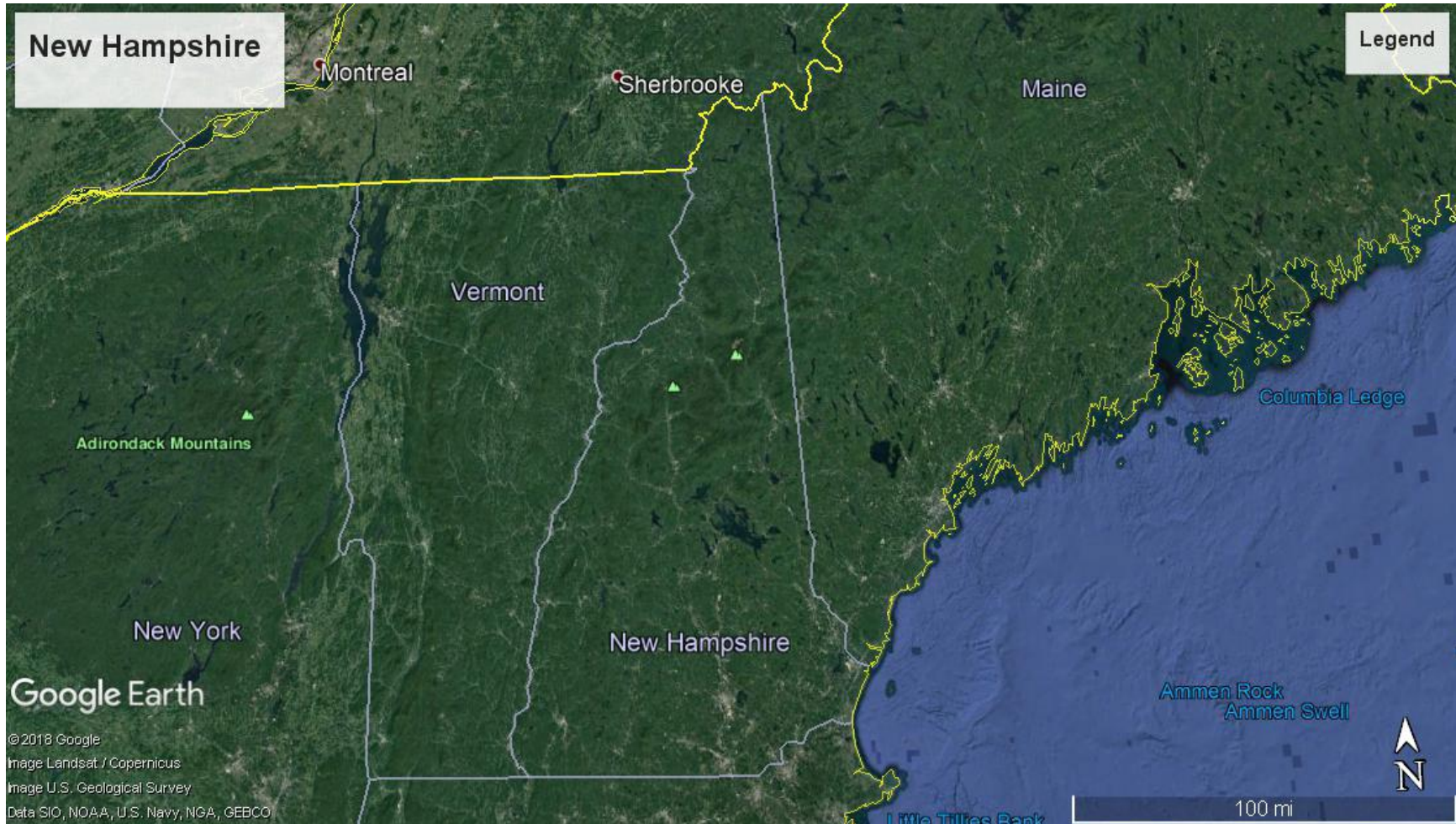
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Map of New England at Night

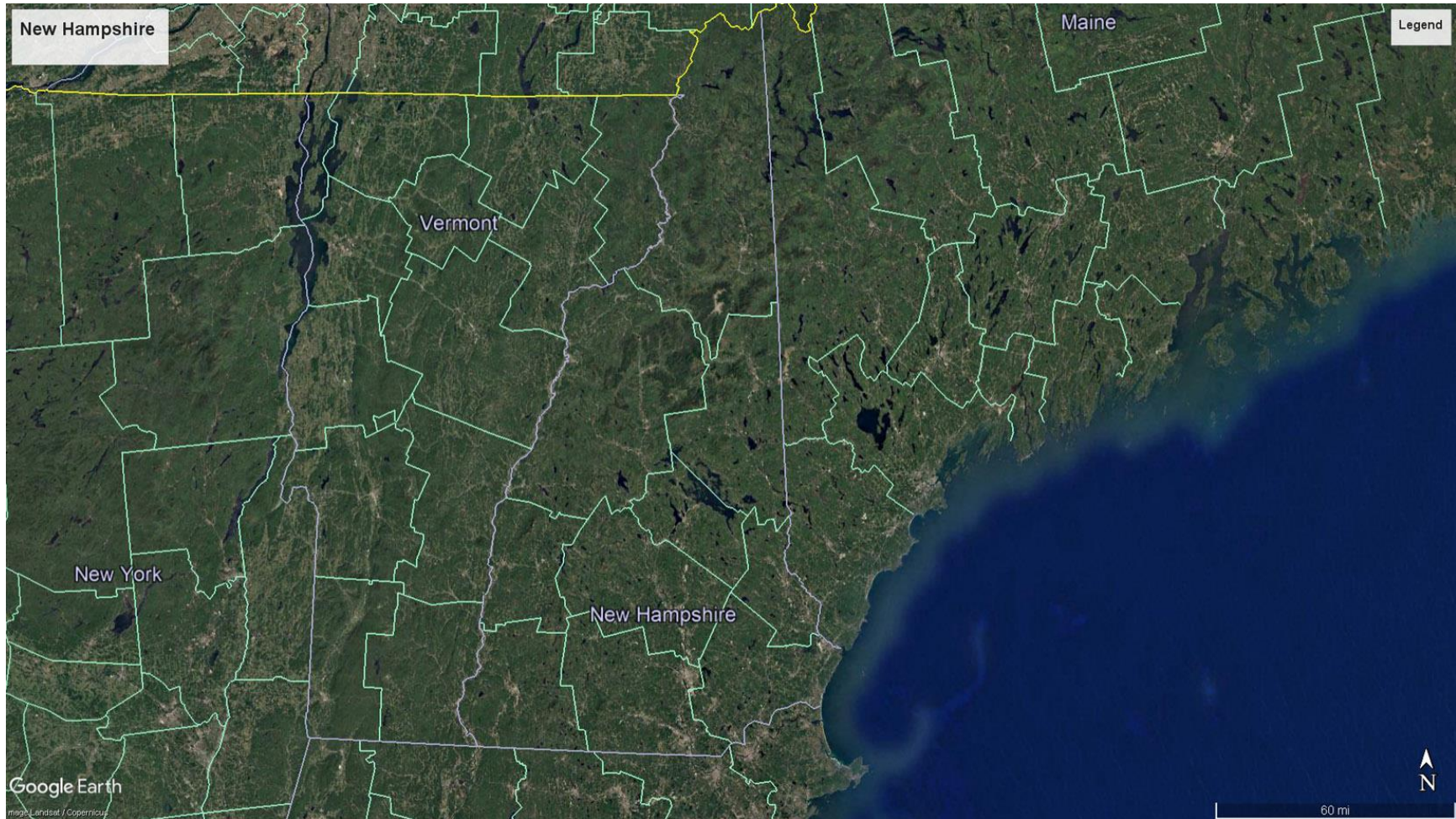
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Map of New Hampshire

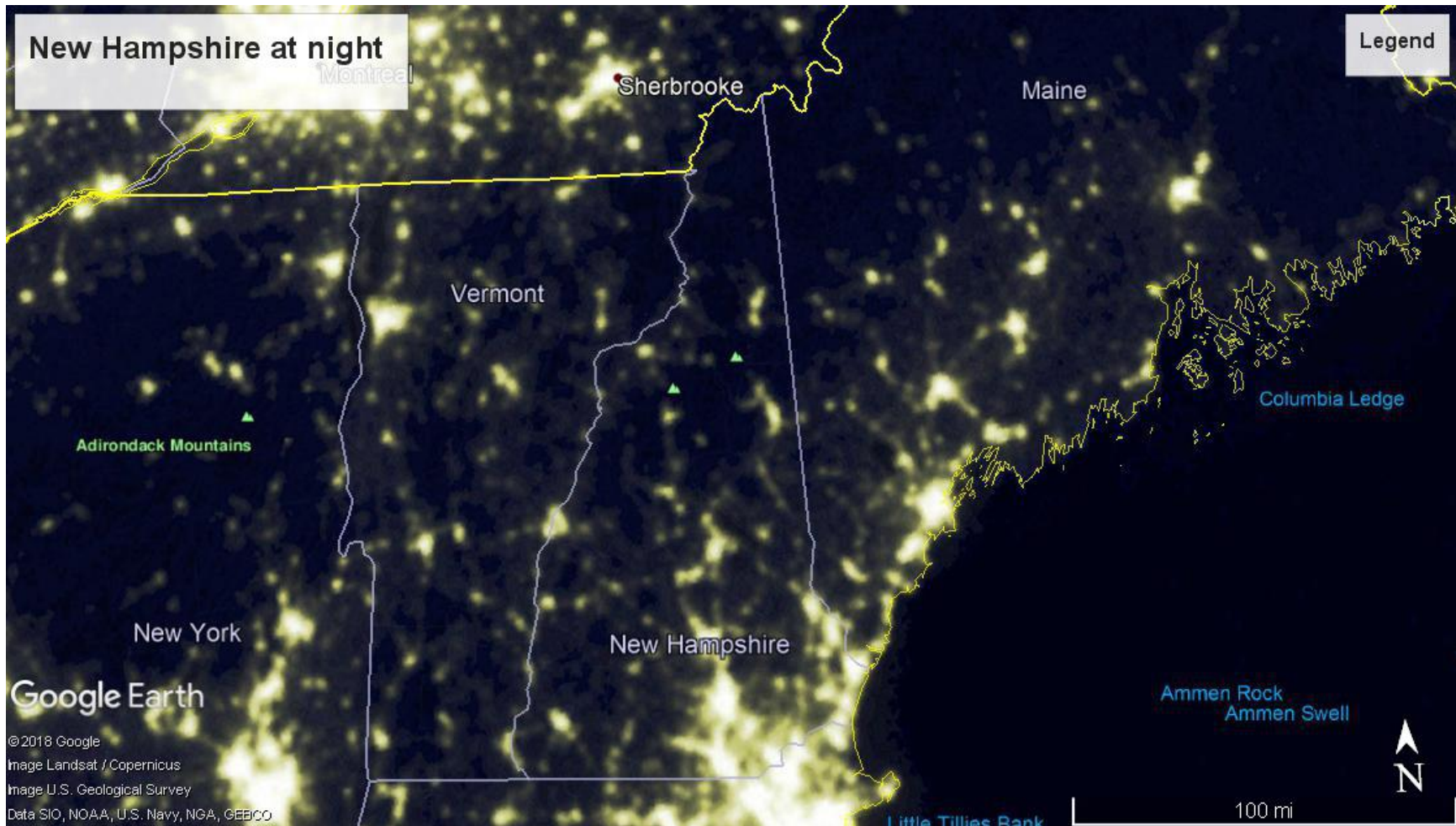
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Map of New Hampshire Counties

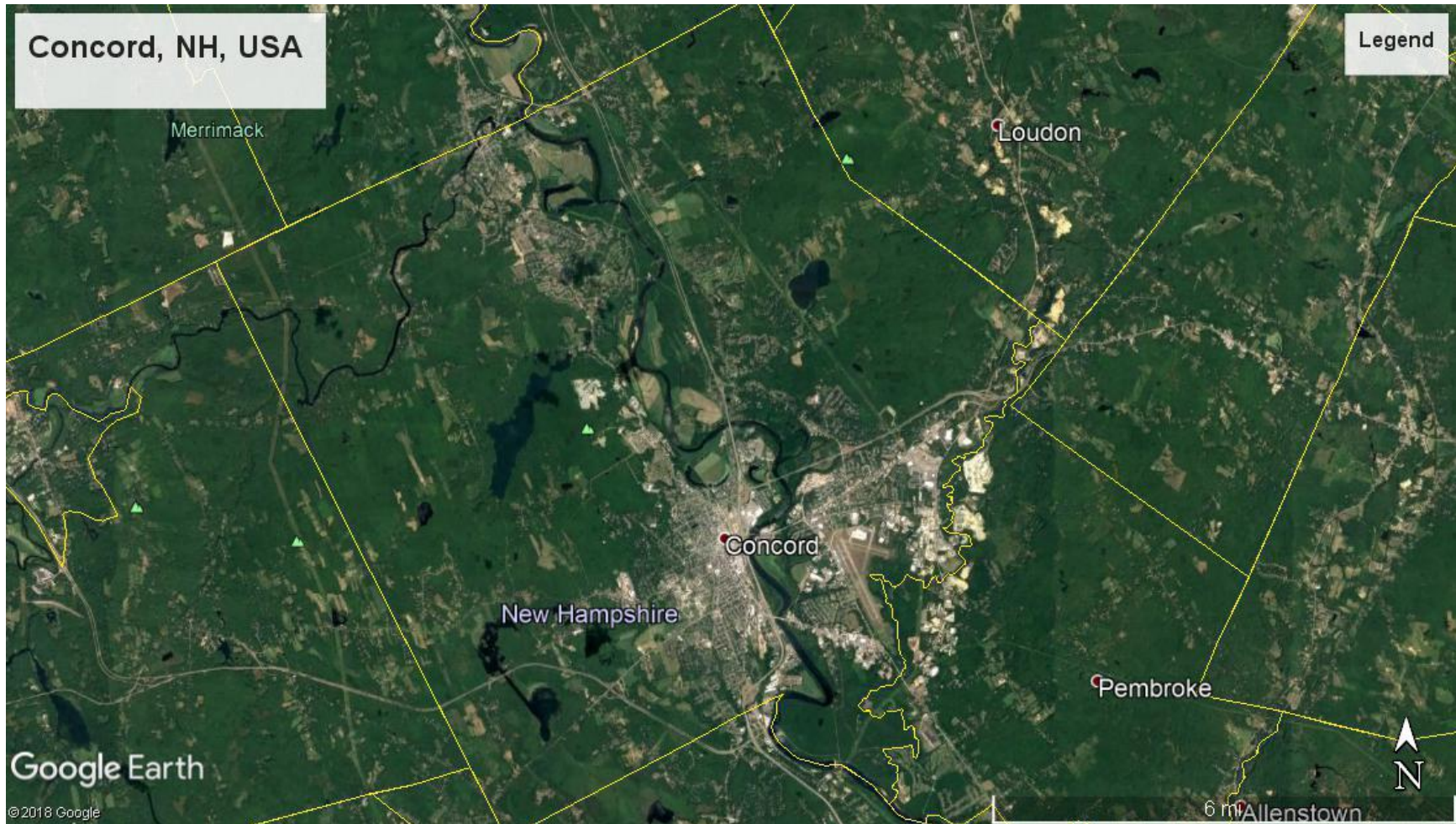
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Map of New Hampshire at Night

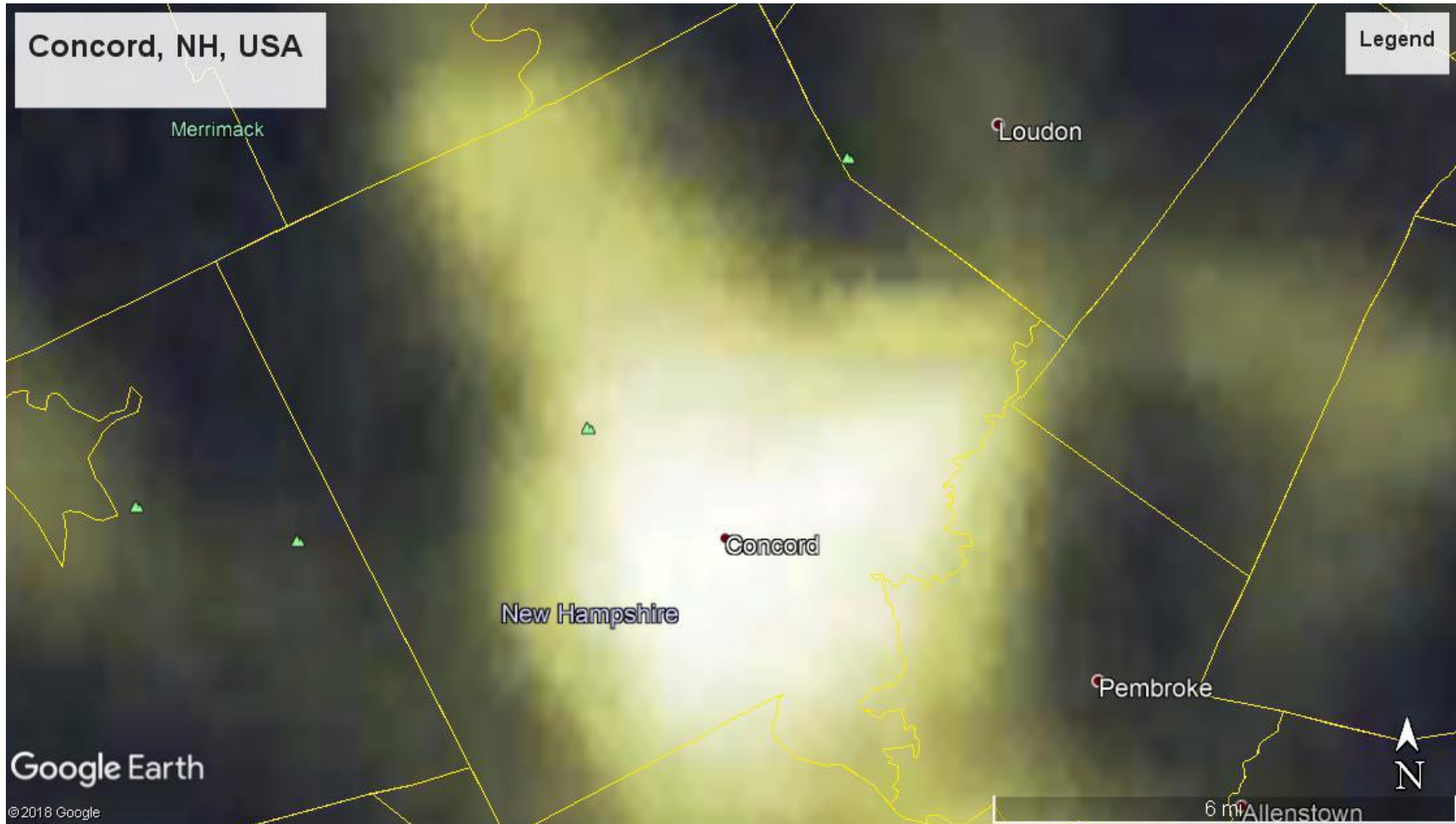

Human and Physical Features

What is a human feature?

(noun) An element added to Earth's surface by people, usually to provide shelter, create borders, or support transportation

What is a physical feature?

(noun) A naturally occurring feature on Earth's surface such as a landform or body of water

Name of map	Visible human features	Visible physical feature
Example: United States at Night	Possible answers include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Borders for country and states • Sources of electric light 	Possible answers include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Distinct shape of land with coastline, peninsulas, and islands • Large bodies of water like oceans and gulfs
Example: New Hampshire	Possible answers include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Major roadways • Borders for country and states 	Possible answers include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Elevation changes, mountain ranges • Lakes • Ocean • Islands
Example: New Hampshire at Night	Possible answers include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sources of electric light 	Possible answers include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coastline • Ocean
Example: Concord, NH, USA	Possible answers include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Buildings • Roadways • Bridges • Cleared areas of land 	Possible answers include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rivers • Forest cover • Lakes • Ponds



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Reflection

1) What is the difference between a physical and a human feature?

A physical feature is something on the earth that exists without humans, like a river or a mountain. A human feature is something on the earth that was created by humans, like lights in a city or a bridge over a river.

2) On which maps did you observe more human features? More physical features? Why do you think that is?

Possible response: I saw more human features on Concord, NH, map and more physical features from maps that were a larger scale, like the United States map or the world map. This might be because human features are usually small and harder to see from very high up.

3) What is the purpose of human features?

Human features are built by humans to help them live on the earth. Human features help people travel around or get food or shelter. Some are for entertainment or for fun, and some might be for government or religion.

4) When you look at maps smaller in scale, what do you notice about the human features and nearby physical features?

Possible response: Yes, from above I can see some human features are planned in certain ways to work with physical features. A city could be built next to good farming land or a state border could be drawn along a river. I think people try to work with physical features of the land because it's easier and better for their lives.

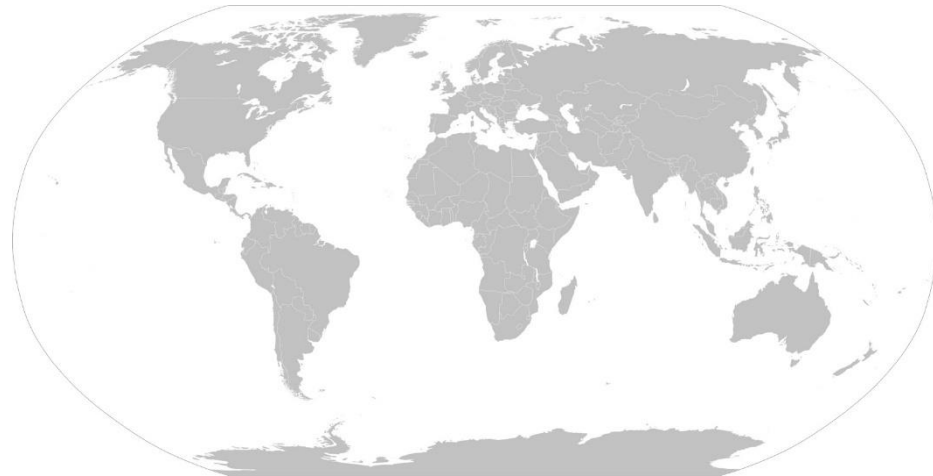

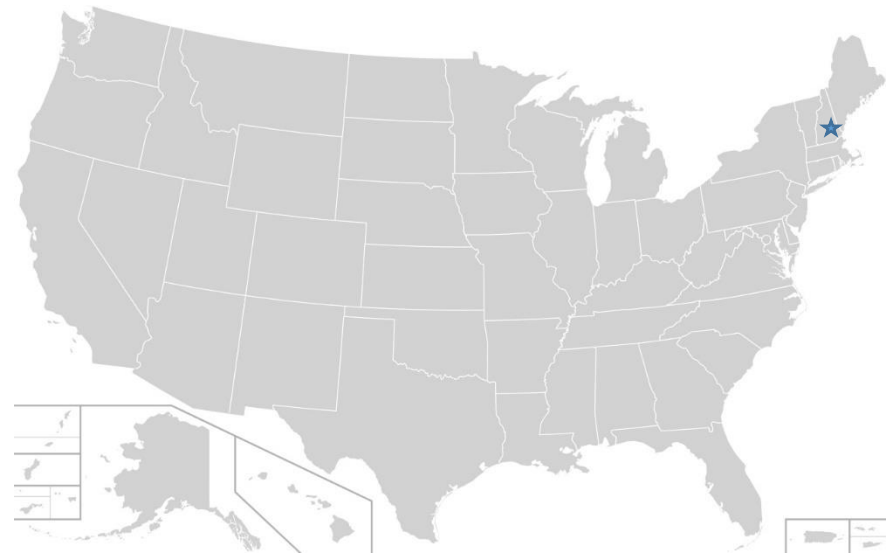
