RAILROADS IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

The first railroad in New Hampshire opened in 1838, just as tourists began to come to the state. By 1890, when this map was made, railroads had been built all over the state, in part because tourists needed the railroads to get to places. Railroads were the fastest and easiest way to travel in 1890.
