MAKE A CAMPAIGN BUTTON

Campaign buttons are small pins a person can wear to show support for a candidate and spread the word about them.

Look at the following examples of real campaign buttons, and then design one yourself!



This button is from when John F. Kennedy ran for president in 1960. Red, white, and blue colors are often used to show patriotism.

This button is from Hillary Clinton's run for president in 2016.

What symbols do you see in this button? It certainly makes you think that New Hampshire supports Hillary! Do you want to include symbols in your button?



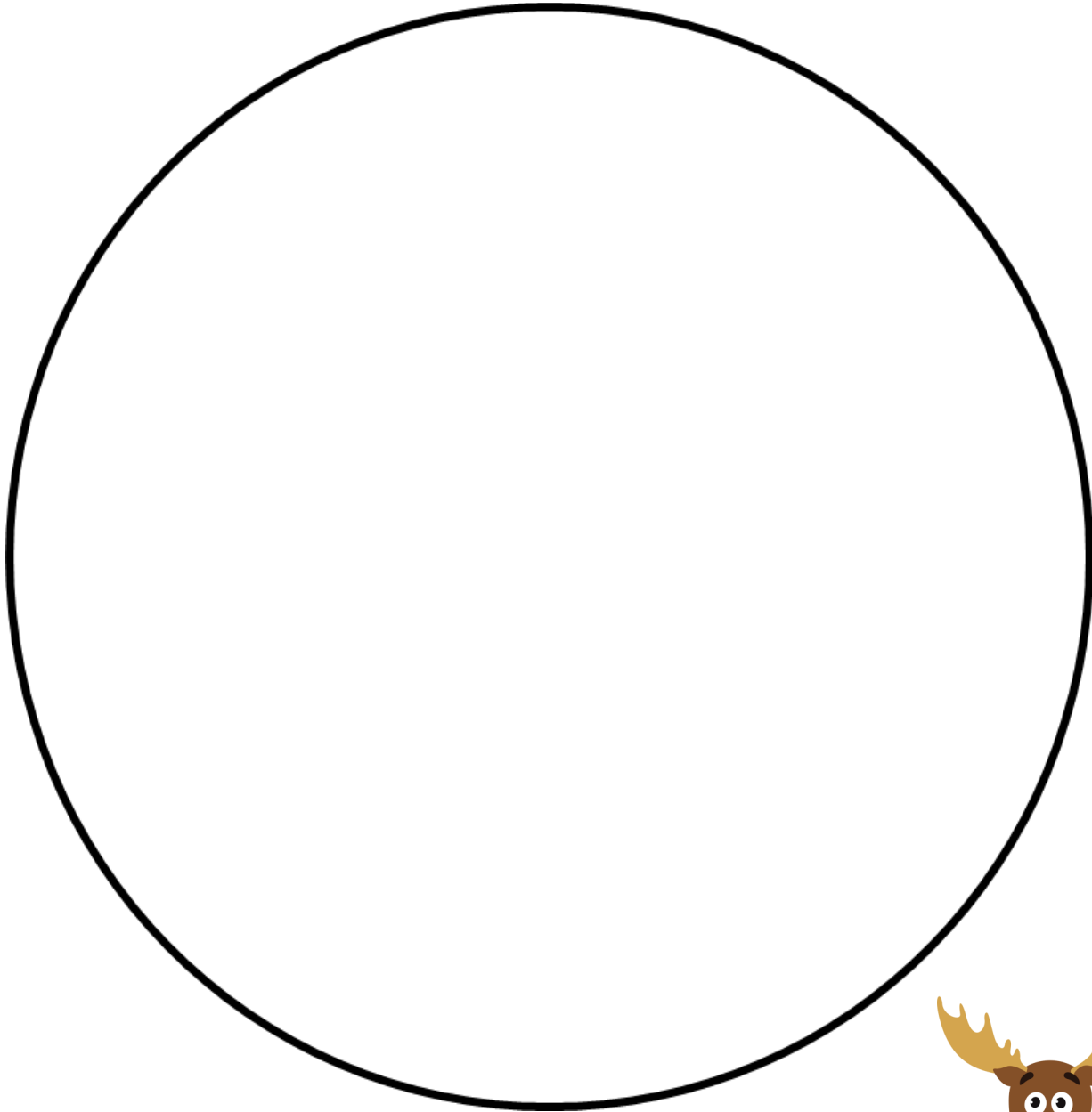
In 2000, Al Gore ran for president and Joe Lieberman for vice president.
