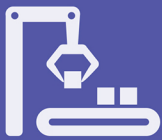

VOTING

PRIMARY: Voters go to a place in their city or town called a polling place. Polling places are open all day. People fill out a paper ballot to pick their choice for the party's nominee. All the ballots are counted up at the end of the night and the winner is announced.

CAUCUS: Voters gather together at 7pm at different places around the state. They stand in groups together based on which candidate they support. If one candidate doesn't get enough support, the voters will move to another candidate until somebody wins.

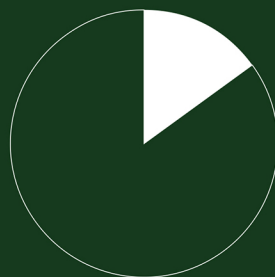
