- 1. I can analyze primary and secondary sources and draw appropriate conclusions.
- 2. I can explain that historical perspectives vary based upon the time period in which the person lived and that those perspectives shaped the historical sources they created.
- 3. I can analyze, use, and construct timelines to explain how events are related chronologically to each other and to explain probable causes and effects of events and developments.
