















TOURIST ACTIVITIES IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

 <p>Hiking</p>	<p>New Hampshire has great hiking for everyone. People who want a shorter hike with great views can visit Mount Monadnock. If you want a harder hike, try hiking the Presidential Range, which includes Mount Washington.  <p>Leaf Peeping</p>	<p>When the weather in New Hampshire starts to get colder, the leaves on the trees change from green to bright shades of red, orange, and gold.  <p>Snow Sports</p>	<p>We all know that New Hampshire gets plenty of snow! You can go skiing at resorts like Loon Mountain, where you can go snow tubing and snowshoeing too.  <p>Shopping</p>	<p>New Hampshire has no sales tax, so lots of people come here to buy things for less money than in their own state! People can look for beautiful old objects at stores on the New Hampshire Antique Trail.  <p>Beaches</p>	<p>There's lots to do at New Hampshire beaches! You can play in the sand or go explore tide pools at Hampton Beach. If you want to fish or go out on a boat, you can try Lake Winnepesaukee. Best of all, you can jump in the water and go swimming on a hot summer day.</p>	<p>Summer</p> <p>Seacoast, Lakes Region, Dartmouth-Sunapee</p> 
 <p>History</p>	<p>New Hampshire may be a small state, but it has a LOT of history to explore. Tourists can visit Concord to come see the treasures at the New Hampshire Historical Society, visit the Millyard in Manchester, or head to the colonial village of Strawbery Banke in Portsmouth.  <p>Sightseeing</p>	<p>Lots of tourists come to New Hampshire just to see the sights and relax. One of the most famous places to go is Franconia Notch, where you can see the Old Man of the Mountain Memorial Site and the Flume.
